



Forging Our Osteopathic Future Campaign




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Thank you to our donors for their generous support of the Forging Our Osteopathic Future campaign!




Initial Certification Grant



- Initial Certification covers up to \$1,400 in exam fees and travel for eligible residents.
 - Partial grants may be awarded.
- Residents must sit for <u>both</u> the AOBFP cognitive and practical exams.
 - Residents can choose between the AOBFP Early Entry Initial Certification (EEIC) pathway or the traditional initial certification pathway.

Applications for the Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 funding cycle will open in July.

PATIENT EDUCATION HANDOUT PMDD Tania Ghazarian, OMS nstruel Dysphoris Disorder (PMDD) is the sovere form of Promonstruel Syndrome (PMS). Symp both physical and emotional caused by normal hormonal changes that begin typically seven to ten days before the start of your period. SYMPTOMS Common emotional ave that can turn into depression, envicely, and extreme modifices. Physical symptoms of PMDD include enemys, blasting joint and/or muscle pairs, breast tendemess and/or enlargement, and headeshes. Scheveral charges include tredmi low energy, difficulty alcoping, food cravings and/or binge cating, crying spells, and panie attacks. management. Antidepressants are used to treat some of the emotional symptoms associated with PMOD. Many patient th PMDD experience depression or thoughts of suicide if not treated. Birth control pills are used to manage normal formonal changes that lead to abnormal emotional and physical reactions in patients with PMDD.
