Categories of Health Alert messages:

Health Alert

Provides vital, timesensitive information for a specific incident or situation; warrants immediate action or attention by health officials, laboratorians, clinicians, and members of the public and conveys the highest level of importance.

Health Advisory

Provides important information for a specific incident or situation; contains recommendations or actionable items to be performed by public health officials, laboratorians, and/or clinicians; may not require immediate action.

Health Update

Provides updated information regarding an incident or situation; unlikely to require immediate attention.

Health Info/Event

Provides general public health information; unlikely to require immediate action.

Summary

The Oklahoma City-County Health Department (OCCHD) has moved to a non-medical referral appointment model for their drive-thru collection site.

OCCHD will continue to schedule appointments for physician referrals received by COB 4/7/2020.

Patients can call 405-425-4489 to schedule an appointment.

Due to the increase in demand of testing, appointments may be scheduled out two to three days.

New Process:

- Patient calls to schedule appointment at provided phone number
- Patient will arrive at collection site at prescheduled appointment time
- Educational material and instructions to stay home will be provided to patient
- Patient will be instructed that provider will notify them when lab results are available.
